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Subject of Review: U.S. foundations are an important source of funds for public needs in the United States and elsewhere, providing more than \$45 billion in grants in 2010. Although this represents a small share of the total contributions to charities and other nonprofit organizations, foundations may have an outsized impact as a result of their relative independence from political and market pressures. Some observers have argued that foundations are neglecting rural America, and that the share of foundation grants for rural development has declined in recent years. However, the available estimates provide very little information on the scope and trends in total foundation giving to rural areas, and do not show how grant funds are distributed geographically. The purpose of this study is to characterize recent trends and patterns of foundation grants to rural communities.
