Subject of Review: Between 2000 and 2021, the mean real wages of U.S. workers grew by percent. However, this growth was distributed unevenly, with real wages of the top 10 percent of earners growing by 26 percent during this period. At the same time, the real wages of the bottom 50 percent grew by only 8 percent. Moreover, the growth in real wages was offset by the declining availability of non-wage benefits provided by employers, including health insurance and retirement benefits. It is thus less clear whether and how job quality – accounting for non-wage benefits as well as wages - has changed for U.S. workers and how such changes in job quality differ across different subpopulations of workers.
